

Key Details for Table Captains

How to register

You can find Hopelink Table Captain and general registration information by visiting hopelink.org/reaching-out-luncheon

- Registration for Table Captains opens on Monday, July 15.
- General registration will open on Thursday, Aug. 1.

Ticket Options

- Table Captains can either...
 - 1. purchase a table of ten for \$1,500

- 2. purchase one ticket for \$150 and commit to filling a table with paid guests
- Tickets are \$150 per person.
- Virtual ticket a no-cost ticket is required to access the live stream.

As event production costs have risen steeply in recent years, your \$150 ticket will help cover these expenses, so we can continue to ensure every penny donated during the event goes to these services. We're so appreciative of your generosity and support for Hopelink.

Table information

- Each table seats a maximum of ten [10] guests, including yourself. Due to event policy, additional chairs can't be added.
- Wheelchair accommodations will reduce the seat count to nine [9] to ensure appropriate space and comfort.
- Table Captains who purchase a table must provide a completed guest list form, including emails for all guests. Forms are due by Friday, Sept. 27
- If Table Captains are unable to completely fill a table, open spots will be filled with general registrants.

About Hopelink

Since 1971, Hopelink has served homeless and low-income individuals and families in north and east King County – providing stability and helping equip them with skills and knowledge to exit poverty.

In 2023, Hopelink partnered with over 62,500 of our neighbors – families, children, seniors, individuals with disabilities, immigrants, and refugees – connecting them with essential services like food, shelter, heat, and transportation. Hopelink also equips our neighbors with skills and knowledge through adult education, money management classes, job coaching, and comprehensive case management.

With your support, Hopelink is proud to be able to respond to the increasing needs of our neighbors. Our impact in 2023 also included:

- 636 individuals experiencing homelessness trusted Hopelink with their housing
- Over \$1.2 million in financial assistance distributed
- 4.1 million meals were provided
- Over \$10.7 million in energy assistance distributed
- 256 adults enrolled in Hopelink's English for Work program

Hopelink programs focus on nine categories of assistance:



Food Assistance

Food markets provide fresh, healthy food, while classes offer nutritional education.



Financial Capabilities

Providing coaching on budgeting, credit, bill paying, debt repayment, savings, and financial recovery.



Family Development

Case managers work with families to address multiple long-term needs.



Employment Services

Assisting clients to develop the skills needed to find work.



Adult Education

Classes prepare clients for the workforce or adult learning.



Energy Assistance

Providing energy assistance grants to help with home heating costs.



Housing

Programs include emergency family shelter and long-term housing.



Transportation

Medicaid transportation; off-route bus access, and assistance with public transportation.



Financial Assistance

Providing support funds during times of financial instability.
